

## REGIONAL COOPERATION



- ❑ **Regional cooperation in MCS** for west african countries is crucial to achieve effective fisheries management, particularly of shared stocks
- ❑ Bilateral, sub-regional and regional cooperation on MCS can include the exchange of fisheries data, harmonized legislation, implementation of flag and **port State control** agreements, and **combined measures** to address IUU fishing
- ❑ In 2014, the African Ministers reaffirmed commitment to strengthen the **MCS capacity including implementation of port states measures**, flag state measures and related instruments in order to combat IUU fishing






# REGIONAL PORT INSPECTION PROGRAM



- ❑ One of the recommendation of MCS in ATLAFCO zone seminar( 2015 Marrakech) is the establishment of a **Regional Port Inspection Program**
- ❑ It was reiterated during the **GFCM/ATLAFCO** joint workshop ( 2016 Tangier)
- ❑ A regional system of port State measures could entail
  - **Common procedures for inspection,**
  - **Qualification requirements for inspection officers**
  - **Agreed consequences for vessels found to be in non-compliance.**
- ❑ Possible common elements could also include, in addition to **denial of port access and/or landing and transshipment of catch, denial of requests for fishing access to coastal State waters and denial of requests for vessel registration**






## FISHERIES INSPECTORS REQUIREMENTS 1/2



Fisheries inspectors should be:

- Thoroughly **conversant** with relevant provisions of the **PSMA**.
- Trained in inspection procedures** as set out in **Article 13** and **Annex B** and consistent with existing, broader port State control inspection procedures.
- Able to design a **sampling plan** for vessel inspection and/or appreciate the importance of doing so in accordance with **Article 12**.





## FISHERIES INSPECTORS REQUIREMENTS 2/2



- ❑ Familiar with the use of **international coding systems** referred to in **Annex D, Paragraph d)**, and required for inspection reports.
- ❑ Conversant with provisions of international fisheries instruments and requirements of **relevant RFMOs and the PSMA** to advise who should receive inspection reports in accordance with **Article 15**.
- ❑ Trained in accordance with **Article 17**, which includes, as a minimum, the areas described in **Annex E**





## BENIFITS OF THE REGIONAL PORT INSPECTION PROGRAM



- ❑ Using information gathered systematically in Regional port inspections can reduce **the overall costs of the port nation's risk assessment and MCS system.**
- ❑ Better regional integration should **reduce the time, effort, and resources spent** on monitoring, pursuing, and inspecting vessels at sea.
- ❑ Regional Port inspection Program is **safer and less expensive** than conventional air and surface compliance enforcement tools.





## The objective of the Regional Port Inspection Program



*The objective is to develop national capacities and promote regional coordination so that countries are better positioned to strengthen and harmonize their port State measures and therefore implement :*

- The relevant tools of FAO's 2001 International Plan of Action to Prevent, Deter and Eliminate IUU Fishing,
- The FAO Model Instrument on Port State Measures 2005 to Combat IUU Fishing
- The 2009 Agreement on Port State Measures to Combat IUU Fishing
