About the ITF

The International Transport Workers' Federation (ITF) is an international trade union federation of transport workers' unions.

Around 700 unions representing over 4.5 million transport workers from some 150 countries are members of the ITF.

The ITF was founded in **1896** in London by European seafarers' and dockers' union leaders who realized the need to organize internationally against strike breakers. Today the ITF organizes workers in ships, ports, railways, road freight and passenger transport, inland waterways, **fisheries**, tourism and civil aviation.

The aims of the ITF are set out in its Constitution:

- ■to promote respect for trade union and human rights worldwide
- to work for peace based on social justice and economic progress
- •to help its affiliated unions defend the interests of their members
- ■to provide **research and information** services to its affiliates
- ■to provide general assistance to transport workers in difficulty

It's now clear that there is an integral link between illegal fishing and unacceptable labour practices and abuse of fisher's human rights




